Thanks also to the many of you who volunteer your time with your daughters' teams and put in countless hours to keep our hockey organization running smoothly.

Tonight I would like to extend a special thanks to someone who has been a driving force since the formation of the Wilmot Girls Hockey Association, and who was our very first President, Peter Postrozny. Peter held the role of President for our first four years, guiding and moulding our organization into what it is today. Peter has held the role of Past President for the past three years, and he is now ready to step down from his 'official' Executive role. Peter, I know I speak for everyone here when I say that you have done an amazing job with the WGHA – you have been a fantastic leader and mentor over the years, and we will miss you on the Executive. Of course, we hope you stay very involved with the WGHA in any capacity that you choose, in the coming years!

Season in Review

Ice Time

- As it is every year, ice time continues to be the biggest concern for the WGHA
- This past year we ran 13 teams plus junior Fundamentals and Women's Fundamentals, for a total of 15 separate groups of skaters. We are anticipating the net addition of one more team this coming year (one less team at Peewee for a total of three PW teams, one more team at Bantam for a total of three Bantam teams, and one more team at Midget for a total of three Midget teams)
- We will be acquiring additional ice to support this extra team we are looking at both the WRC and at nearby facilities

• Our ice scheduler did a great job this season of rotating the early 6:30 AM Friday morning and 4:30 PM ice through the teams who could make use of it; we know these can be more challenging times for both coaches and parents

Financial

- WGHA continues to be in solid financial shape
 - The Kyla Kowalik Tournament continues to be a significant and important fundraiser
 - Raffle ticket fundraiser new format generated lots of excitement about prizes
 - Our 'Girls Got Game' summer hockey camp was again a huge success in 2013 and it filled up extremely quickly for our 2014 camp there are only a couple of spots left
 - Particular thanks to our Directors who run these events Lisa Clifford, Lori Spoltore, and Holly Bast
 - We appreciate the continued support of our community sponsors
- Ice time costs continue to go up marginally
 - We experienced a 1.3 % increase for 2013-2014
 - We are expecting another small 1.2% increase for ice during the 2014-2015 season

Issues

- We have fielded some concerns about the distribution of ice times among our WGHA teams
- There will be a presentation on this further into this meeting
- Generally, teams will have to expect more early morning and early weekday evening practice times and older teams will have to accept later evening practice times, as we try to maximize use of our allotted block of ice time until Wilmot can open a third ice pad to alleviate the shortage
- Also, some teams may be assigned practice times at other arenas if we can secure a couple of hours of ice outside of the WRC – use of ice times outside the WRC would likely be limited to Rep teams

New Initiatives and Highlights

- For the first time, WGHA iced three teams at the BB level Peewee BB, Bantam BB, Midget BB
- Wilmot Optimist Youth Appreciation Karley Dajka was our winner
- Coming soon OWHA Respect in Sports program14-05-21

All in all, the year has been a very successful one, and again, thanks to all of you for your many and various contributions to this success.

C. Vice-President – Michele Brenneman

Thank you to our coaches, trainers, and parent volunteers that step up to help us make this the great organization that we have. You have all contributed to our continued success as we complete our 7th season as an organization. We had 15 teams (2 include the ladies and youth fundamentals) of which we had 251 players registered this season, the most ever. All teams with the exception of our Pee Wee LL teams were full.

I also want to recognize our current executive who are all passionate about Female hockey and are all looking at ways to make things better for our association.

This season we added a new team - our Senior C team which played in the Southwest Women's Hockey league. With adding a senior team, Wilmot is now considered a Full association having teams at all levels including Senior. Although the team experienced a very serious issue that threatened to fold the team in November, the players that remained helped to keep things going with some help from the midget LL team.

I would also like to note that we had our first wolverine play internationally. Alex Glencross a member of the senior team took part in the 2014 Pan American Tournament in Mexico City in March. The OWHA had sent a request for players and teams. A senior a team from Sudbury went as well as a group of 16 players that were assembled into the other team. The Sudbury team won the Gold. Alex mentioned that it was a fantastic experience for her. There were players attending from Mexico, Brazil, Columbia, Argentina and Canada. The other Ontario team of which Alex played on finished in 3rd.

We continued with our iceless practices this year and continue to be well received by the teams that took advantage of this. The challenges that were presented though included the renovations that took place at the New Hamburg arena in the lobby area and our extremely cold winter, which made the arena extremely cold and provided conditions that were not suitable for having our players practice there.

We attempted to pull together our first DS team in peewee, however we did not have enough interest to successfully field this team.

OWHA Annual General Meeting – May 10, 2014

The guest speaker at the OWHA annual meeting this year was Brian Hart, the OWHA head scout. Brian spoke about reinforcing the idea with all our coaches whether it is a rep or LL team that all players play, that there should be no shortening of the bench. The only way players can learn all parts of the game is by playing and being given the opportunity to play. It's tough on the players when they are at a game and they sit on the bench more than they play. Minor hockey is about development. The championships are the byproduct of playing and developing your players.

There is going to be a new U16 program for the OWHA – similar to the U18 program to develop the players at the highest level. He noted that Ontario is very deep in talent, we have a great source of players and many have moved on to play at the highest level.

I would like to make a comment about some feedback that we have received this year regarding team sizes for the Representative teams. We had a question about the number of players that we take on our rep teams. The comment was why we would not have taken fewer players thus creating a stronger rep team. In response to this question, our first priority in this hockey association is development. In order to develop more players, you need to expose them if possible to higher levels of hockey. In most cases the players tend to play to the level they are playing in. If we limited the number of rep spots to 12 or 13 skaters, there would be those 2 or 3 players who would be denied the opportunity to play at a higher level and as a result you may miss some really great players, that through hard work and determination develop into some terrific players. We also have more girls playing in our association and in order to have as many spots available – we need to take full teams.

Secondly, we had some questions around three of our teams playing at the BB level. They all had great seasons, although the midget team missed the playoffs, it by a tiebreaker. That team was in most of their games. Had they played at B the chances are they would have been recatagorized up to BB anyway.

All our teams that played at BB, did well, we may not have won championships, but if you look at the play of the teams, they were never really blown out and the outcome of many of the games could have went either way. As a result we had three teams of players playing at a higher level. Wilmot has come a long way since our first year of 5 teams. Our players are hardworking and competitive, whether playing representative or Local League.

OWHA – Meeting Notes

- 1. Cyber bullying noted that several high profile news television programs are now investigating the infamous network 54 where a great deal of cyber bulling takes place.
- 2. Cyber bullying need to look at the adults as well as the players that are involved note suspensions have been given this season for Cyber bullying
- 3. Discussion around mental health issues we were given some good information sheets about mental health and cyber bullying
- 4. Items for vote the mouth guard issue was table to the 2015 meeting. The wording of the motion was very vague and needed to be reworked.
- 5. A motion was brought forward and defeated about limiting AA teams to just one team per association. The issue had this been passed was that larger centers who could field the AA teams

would be looking at implementing a no import policy had this passed. As a result many girls that come from smaller centers looking to play at a higher level would have not had the opportunity to do so.

- 6. Respect in Sport parent program the OMHA has mandated this program for all parents; the OWHA had tabled a motion to recommend that one parent or guardian take this program. This was defeated. Our association supports parents taking this program, and will be making the link available on our website, however, we are not making it mandatory. It is a great program, which takes about an hour to complete. It not only deals with respecting the coaches and officials, but also about keeping things in perspective for your child as well as some great information about nutrition, fitness and your child's overall well-being.
- 7. Registration if a player has taken a year or two off and then goes to a new association to play hockey, they are still required to obtain a release from their previous center.

I would like to note that the OWHA would be celebrating their 40th season. That is very exciting for women's hockey.

Thank you for the opportunity to be a part of this great association. I look forward to the many more great things that we will do in the coming seasons.

D. Registrar - Mel Weiler

Registration continues to grow in the WGHA. Total players for this current season topped 245. We increased by two teams - we added a second team in Midget, but only had two teams in Novice and Atom, in Pee Wee we had 4 teams plus the addition of the Senior team.

Some of the challenges faces this season include:

- 1. For the first time, we had to turn players away in Atom as we were full, but not enough players were registered to add a third team
- 2. Senior Team almost folded, due to an incident involving a player and coach, the team lost 5 players plus one to injury. Fortunately the team then picked up three new players and with help from the Midget LL team were able to continue.

- 3. *In order for the Novice teams to proceed, we moved up 6 Fundamental age players. These players had completed two years of Fundamentals.
- 4. In Bantam we accommodated the extra players at this level by moving up three second year Bantam players to the Midget LL team. The Midget LL team comprised of more than half of the team being first year players.

2014-2015 Season

If most of the players return this season, we are looking at adding one, possibly two more teams. Given our current icetime allotment, many will question if this is possible. One team will potentially be added at the novice level, these teams will most likely share ice. If we have the numbers in Midget, we will be adding a team at that level and will be looking to secure additional ice to support this team. In the midget level it is more difficult to determine as some players do leave do to other commitments such as part time jobs, high school interests.

We look forward to another exciting season for our Wolverines.

E. Development Director – Holly Bast

Pre-Season Skate – "Dust the Rust Off"

- Last week of August 2013
- Each age group was offered two sessions
- Lead by Kevin Winters, New Hamburg Skating Club
- Feedback: Great to get the players back on skates again and get warmed up, but many also suggested we should consider an Instructor with more hockey related experience

Goalie Coach Clinic – Led by Liam Johnston with The Goalie Consultants

- Saturday, September 28th, 2013
- 1 ½ hours in classroom, 1 hour on ice
- Each team was required to send their designated goalie coach
- Costs were shared with the Stratford Aces
- Goal: Provide our goalie coaches with valuable drills and skills to support the development of the goalies in their four sessions
- Feedback: Both coaches new to the goalie coach role and coaches with experience were able to pick up valuable information and feel they were being consistent with what the goalies were working on in their training

Goalie Training Sessions – Led by Liam Johnston with The Goalie Consultants

- 4 sessions: October 27th, November 17th, December 1st, January 19th
- 1 hour each session
- Open to all Wolverine goalies
- Cost covered by WGHA, players paid a deposit for each session they
 registered for and received their money back in full if they attended the
 sessions they registered for
- Goal: To develop both our new and experienced goalies
- Feedback: excellent structure of drills in small groups allowing for individual attention for each goalie





Body Contact Clinic – Led by ES Hockey Training

- Sunday, October 6th, 2013
- Open to Peewee and Bantam Aged Players
- \$10/player, WGHA helped offset the costs
- Goal: Prepare our players for the incidental contact that occurs in the game, trying to reduce the number of injuries, especially head injuries (concussions)
- Feedback: Excellent development session for this age group; helps players to see the importance of keeping their head up, and learn important positioning along the boards. Coaches felt this would be valuable to Atom aged players mid-season

Coach Development Sessions – Led by ES Hockey Training

- Six sessions: Beginning of October, November, December, January, February, and March
- 30 minutes of chalk-talk, and one hour on ice with two Wolverine teams each session
- WGHA paid initiative
- Goal: Provide regular communication with a valuable resource, focus on a variety of skills throughout the season
- Feedback: Excellent development opportunity. Would be ideal if this ice time was in addition to the team's regular ice time that week, instead of replacing it. Coaches felt that every session was important in helping them prepare for each aspect of the season, including playoff strategies

Year End Coaches Feedback Meeting

- Held March 31st, prior to Volunteer Appreciation Event
- Meeting was in addition to the Year End Surveys open to all coaching staff members
- Each time was asked to have one or two staff members to attend to share their feedback
- Discussed a variety of topics from the current year (development initiatives, # of teams and levels of categorization, league experiences)
- Collected suggestions to assist with plans for next season

H. Ice Scheduler – Darlene Vorstenbosch

2013-2014 was a hectic season for the WGHA. We added a Senior team and moved our Midget Rep team to BB. Both these teams needed 80-minute game times. We also had a brutal winter that led to multiple game delays, cancellations and rescheduling. This meant moving around games and practices to fit all the games in before end of season deadlines. It also put more pressure on our already tight ice time. Thanks to coaches, players and parents for their flexibility this season.

We added 2 early morning practices and an extra half hour on Tuesdays this year which helped in getting teams at least one practice each week, although it did not always work out as teams would have away games and tournaments which meant they were not always available for weekend practices. We were also able to use the early morning ice times on Sundays for goalie clinics instead of taking prime time ice that we could use for games. For next season we are looking for ice outside of the township but this will be early morning and late night ice times not prime time and it will come with a higher cost for the association as our ice here is subsidized. There were some scheduling conflicts this season around the booking of coaches' clinics, as were waiting to see how the teams would be categorized and the amount of ice time they would need and then the instructors were not available on dates we had chosen. This season we are looking to pre-book all clinics over the summer to avoid this problem.

We had a number of issues this season with coaches cancelling ice at the last minute. We ask for 10 days notice for a team to cancel ice, as we need to give the township 7 days notice of cancellation or we will still have to pay for the ice. The extra time gives us time to find another team to take the ice or to cancel. It is hard to reschedule practices with enough notice for parents when we do not receive the cancellation in a timely fashion. With our tight ice allotment we really do not like to see the ice sitting empty. We will be looking to work closely with all coaches to see if we cannot fix this issue.

Use of the website has been very beneficial this year. It makes it easier to see what teams are available to take an extra practice if one should come available, especially if the teams keep all their calendars updated. It still takes time to contact the coaches to see if they will take the practice but there are fewer teams that we need to contact. Our preference is to schedule all practices to Christmas in early

October and from January to March in December. If the weather cooperates next season, the schedule should be more consistent then this past season.

This season say one rep team going to Lower Lakes Championship Weekend; and three going to Provincials. We also had 5 local league teams going on to semi finals and the Kitchener League Championship Weekend. This meant that there was far less "extra " ice available for teams then in other years. Our ice contract runs from September to March so ice for rep teams going on to Provincials and league championship weekend had to be booked from what spring ice was not being used by groups who regularly book ice for April and May. This meant we were getting a lot of early evening or morning and late night practice times.

Question by Mel James – daughter played local league and was still playing in March. Unfortunately the perception was that the other teams were not still in the running.... Question is are we giving preference to teams who are still in the running? Darlene has asked to table it and discuss off line as she cannot recall the team she is speaking of. She is aware of the coach that declined ice time and curious if that is the same coach with the issue?

Over the summer we will be going through a number of scenarios as to how best to assign the ice that we have once we get the contract for next season. Once the number of teams is finalized in August and we know what ice if any that we can add here or elsewhere, we will decide how best to assign ice. The first few weeks of the ice schedule should be up on the website in mid- August, hopefully up to scheduling day for the 2 leagues we have to schedule for.

K. Tournament Director – Lisa Clifford

This year the Kyla Kowalik tournament was run January 10, 11, and 12, 2014. It was the 7th Annual Kyla Kowalik tournament and the third year that we have had it on the second weekend of January. It seems to be a good weekend for attracting teams, better than when we held it on a later weekend.

We were unable to field a Novice division as we only had 2 teams register for it. Had to fold it as per OWHA rules. We did still have 28 teams register for the tournament in total: with 10 Atom teams, 6 Peewee teams, 8 Bantam teams and 4 Midget teams. Going forward would hope to run all the divisions that we have here in Wilmot at local league.

We definitely had an increased number of out of town teams. These were teams that use our tournament for their "sleep away" tournament.

Looking forward to next year, we have booked the arena ice surfaces, community center and lobbies for January 9, 10, and 11, 2015. All is hopeful that things go well then too.
