PHYSICAL DISTANCING AND CAPACITIES:

- WGHA will assign one Board of Directors Executive member as a point of contact for facility usage.
- The executive members will explain the WRC facility rules, guidelines and process that is outlined in the WRC arena use covid package. This package will be provided to each hockey association member who rents/uses the ice for use.
- Ice participants will come in arena fully dressed carrying only skates, stick, gloves and helmet in hand or using a small bag.
- Each association will only allow coaches, trainers and players from the 2019-2020 season to be on the ice.
- Our hockey associations will cease to allow ice rental to coaches (also known as permit holders) if they fail to follow the facility distancing guidelines.

HYGIENE:

Permit holders will ensure participants and parents from our organizations do the following:

- Screen each participant on the same day prior to them entering the facility and ensure each person understands the rules and follows the facility and association COVID rules and guidelines.
- No one is allowed in facility without a screening form completed and parents are to wait for their child to be approved to enter arena before they leave the parking lot.
- Wash hands/hand sanitizer before entering and when else needed.
- Masks must be worn while indoors and or on the bench until on the ice where then they can be removed.
- Absolutely no sharing of water bottles and they are to be properly labelled.
- All handshakes are to be eliminated.
- Tissue can be used to blow nose if on the bench and disposed in garbage properly. After disposing of tissues hand sanitizer must be used.
- No spitting or blowing nose on the ice without tissue is absolutely forbidden.

TRAINING AND EDUCATION:

- Permit holders will inform participants, staff and spectators at beginning of ice time what the facility rules
 are prior to allowing them to enter the building for their ice time.
- Permit holders will utilize their ice time with non-contact, social distancing hockey drills.
- Non ice members (parents, spectators, etc.) will be allowed on the bench to tie skates while wearing a mask and return to the designated lobby area or leave arena during the duration their child's ice time.
- Once someone leaves the arena, they are not allowed to re-enter without be screened again by the permit holder

RESPONSE PLANNING:

If you TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID 19 PLAN:

- Participant to advise coach/safety person immediately
- They need to follow up with their physician and public health for instructions.
- Participant is not to return to hockey until all Public Health steps have been taken.
- Note from doctor required to return to play.

If not feeling well plan:

- Participant to advise coach/safety person immediately
- Follow up with physician and participant will require a doctor's not to return to play.

COMPLIANCE:

- Permit holders will provide to their organizational contact the completed screening forms for each player and keep copies for themselves for at least 4 weeks' time.
- Failure to follow up the rules and conditions of use will result in immediate removal of participants from a
 program and will result in the cancellation of the contract between the user and Township of Wilmot.
 Refunds will be provided.

GAME PLAY SAFETY PLAN FOR WGHA: UPDATED OCTOBER 14, 2020

- Wilmot Wolverines will be playing against Waterloo Ravens, Cambridge Roadrunners, Kitchener Lady Rangers, Ayr Rockets, Woolwich Wild, Twin Centre Hericanes and Brantford Ice Cats this season. Each level will vary on who they will be playing.
- Permission was given by Connie Tinney from the Region of Waterloo Public Health Unit to our extended
 play group to allow Brantford to play; specifically it was confirmed that there is no restrictions on teams
 from Waterloo Region going to play in other Public Health Units and for those teams to come and play in
 Waterloo Region.
- See attached for the list of the extended play groups for all levels.
- The home team coach (Wilmot) is responsible for screening all Wilmot participants and their parent; the coach will also ensure that the away coach has done the appropriate screening necessary and that that team will have that documentation on file, in case it is required for contact tracing.
- The coach will also keep count to ensure they are under the total number of 50 people.
- The home team will enter the arena first, so there is no crossing of players in the skate tying area.
- The WGHA has a database of all the contact tracing information, done by team and by date and time of ice time. If the WGHA is notified of a positive case of Covid, we will contact public health immediately to see what direction is necessary to take for our Wilmot team(s) as well as the extended play group.
- We will notify the Township of Wilmot immediately as well.
- We are aware that the other teams that we are playing against all have plans for holding onto their contract tracing documentation (whether online or on paper).
- We will also provide all contact tracing information to them, as well as the contacts from the teams within the extended group play of 50 players.
- WGHA will also readily have a list of the Covid team contacts for all of the associations we will be playing against.
- We will continue to pay attention to Public Health announcements and be ready to make any modifications should we need to.
- A contact in our extended playing group follows up with Connie Tinney from Public Health on a weekly basis to ensure nothing has changed.

 WGHA has advised the visiting team of all protocols and procedures in place for the WRC (provided to township ice scheduler for screening purposes as well as sanitization of referee dressing rooms and timekeepers area.

TIMEKEEPERS AND REFEREES

- Referees and timekeepers will be screened in at the door by the Township.
- They have all provided their full contact information in case it is needed.
- Referees are able to use the ref rooms.
- There will be a maximum of only 2 referees per game.
- Timekeepers will go straight to the timekeeper booth and remain there until the game begins.
- After the game, if they are timekeeping another game, they will remain by the timekeeper booth.
- Timekeepers must wear a mask at all times.
- Referees and timekeepers have been made aware to advise the WGHA COVID email for any
 positive COVID test and will contact PHU and the township will be advised.
- Timekeepers will be dropping the game sheet in the door slot of the WGHA office within the WRC after the game is complete.
- Referees are expected to social distance on the ice.
- Referees will be following OWHA rules for modified game play to ensure that prolonged or intentional physical contact does not occur and will address any issues related to this.
- Refs are to ensure that there are to be no scrums/gatherings on the ice and all body checking will be penalized; no handshakes with players or coaching staff or referees; ensuring no celebration of goals occurs.
